

Homework Grid – Spring Term

- Please complete **6** of the tasks below over the **Spring Term** (from now until Easter)
The tasks relate to our Class Topic of: *Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings*
- You could tick off a task as you complete it!
- The homework tasks should be completed in this book but could be in the form of written work, photos, drawings/diagrams, PowerPoint slides etc. Please remember high standards of presentation!
- In addition to this, there will be a piece of **Maths or English** homework each week, along with **10 Spellings** to learn for a test. We also ask that the children read at least **3** times every week and practise their times tables and corresponding division facts.
- Homework will be given out on a **Wednesday** and collected in on the following **Monday**.
- Spellings will also be given out on **Wednesday** for a test on the following **Monday**.

Imagine you were a Viking ruler for a day... write how you would spend your day, would you make new laws, where would you visit, who would you see etc.	The Vikings loved to play games – see if you can invent your own Viking game. Remember, the restrictions of the era (no electricity etc).	Design and draw/paint your own piece of Viking jewellery.	The Vikings took up many roles (farmers, warriors, sailors etc). Write about which role you would like to have lived, and explain what you would have done and why.
Paint or draw a Viking warrior.	Write a diary entry – A day in the life of a Viking warrior on the way to/back from a raid.	The Vikings relied heavily on their famous Long ships. Make a model of your own Viking Long ship.	Create a short PowerPoint explaining the 9 Norse worlds.
Create a factsheet about the Viking kings (include 10 facts).	Create your own map depicting where the Vikings invaded.	Create your own Viking menu for a feast. Feel free to add pictures and colour.	Find and read a book about Vikings. This can be factual or fictional. Write a book review describing what you liked or disliked about it.
